Tini Tinou Festival: A Circus festival touching the heart of crowds.

Phare Performing Social Enterprise and Phare Ponleu Selpak are pleased to announce the organization of the Tini Tinou 2015 international circus festival in May 2015. This package will give you a full brief of the festivals history, ambition for 2015 and sponsoring opportunities.

Tini Tinou in 2014: Rebirth of the Festival

Mission of the festival:

The Tini Tinou International Circus Festival started in Cambodia in 2004, and ran until 2010 in both Phnom Penh and Battambang. Phare Ponleu Selpak and the French Cultural Center (what is now the French Institute in Cambodia) gathered artists from around the world, providing entertainment and artistic exchange between dancers, musicians and circus artists. The intercultural relations developed during the Festival stimulated creativity and human development. In 2014, Phare artists travelled from their home base of Siem Reap to Phnom Penh to present their show « Eclipse » in celebration of Europe Day. In order to share the skills of these talented performers with a wider audience, Phare Performing Social Enterprise and Phare Ponleu Selpak joined hands with the National Circus School of Cambodia to revive the Tini Tinou Festival.

A community event for all in Phnom Penh:

The festival took place in the beautiful big top of the National Circus School of Cambodia next to the Naga World. The big top can seat 1,000+ people and was full both nights. Thanks to the generous contribution of our sponsors, we were able to invite close to 400 children from local NGOs: Pour un Sourire d'Enfants, Krousar Thmey, Mit Samlanh, Enfants du Mekong, Taramana, Sunflower Orphans, Cambodian Living Arts and Mary Knoll.

The NGO Krousar Thmey said: *"A Big thank you for this beautiful show. The children loved it so much! They were amazed and laughed a lot, so good to see!"*

Over 650 tickets were then sold to the general public for 4usd per person (children under 5 years old were free) with all ticket revenues going to support the Center for Circus and Performing Arts. The remaining tickets were given to our sponsors as a benefit of their sponsorship package. Most of those tickets were used as there was a huge interest from the Cambodian staff of both ANZ royal and Smart.

Program for the 2015 edition:

Date: May 7th to May 16th

Tini Tinou 2015: Scaling up the festival with nationwide audience and international performers.

In 2015, the festival will grow to its original multi-city tour with an international line-up. In addition to Phare, The Cambodian Circus, and the National Circus School of Cambodia, five international troupes from Asia and Europe will join to both perform acts and shows for audiences, and take part in artist exchange workshops.

The festival will tour between Battambang, Siem Reap, and the capital Phnom Penh, in the hopes of giving audiences across Cambodia and worldwide tourists a new theatrical experience and opportunity to see world-class performers.

Country of origins of the troupes invited:

- ❖ Cambodia - Phare, the Cambodian Circus and the National Circus School of Cambodia
- ❖ Taiwan - Formosa Circus
- ❖ France - O ultimo Momento
- ❖ Vietnam - Ho Chi Minh City Circus School
- ❖ Switzerland - Les Papillons
- ❖ Laos - National Circus School

Location and venues of the festival:

The Festival will tour around the 3 major cities of Cambodia:

Phnom Penh:

May 7th, 8th and 9th.

Target crowd: Cambodians middle class, children from NGOs, international and expat communities

Venue: Big Top of the National Circus School of Cambodia (over 1000 seats).



Siem Reap:

May 11th, 12th, and 13th

Target crowd: Tourists, local community and children from NGOs

Venue: Big Top of Phare, the Cambodian Circus (over 300 seats)



Battambang:

May 15th and 16th

Target Crowd: Local community, tourists and children from NGOs

Venue: Big Top of Phare Ponleu Selpak (over 200 seats).



Total direct audience of the festival = 3,700 people (+ indirect audience thanks to advertizing and media coverage)

Structure of the festival:

Festival will be structured around 8 performance nights, workshops among the artists and street parades in the 3 cities so that this it is both an exchange between the people and the arts but also among artists.

1.Shows:

Each troupe will perform several times in each city. The shows will not be split over several locations on the same day at the same time but be organized in a successive manner so that crowds get a chance to see them all and not have to choose between shows.

2.Workshops:

Artists will be given a chance to share their experience and skills. Workshops are to be organized in all three cities.

The goal is also to give Cambodia an opportunity to be a hub in Asia for circus arts. It is also to use the growing fame of Phare Ponleu Selpak in the world of circus to promote circus in Asia.

The festival is organized by Phare Performing Social Enterprise, the business arm of Phare Ponleu Selpak and aims at being at a minimum a self sustaining project and at best a fundraising event.



Phare Ponleu Selpak

Phare Ponleu Selpak (PPS) is a not-for-profit Cambodian association working with vulnerable children, young adults and their families through three interweaving fields of intervention: art schools, social support and educational programmes.

Nine young Cambodians created Phare Ponleu Selpak in 1994, following their return to their country after a childhood spent in the refugee camps at the Thai border. They wanted to help to rebuild their country through social and educative actions and, importantly, the recognition of Khmer art and culture. The organisation gradually grew to support more and more children living in difficult situations, including street kids, trafficked children and orphans, and helped them to reintegrate into society through the medium of culture and arts.

The artistic training offered has been found to aid concentration, communication and creative thinking skills, thus vastly improving the opportunities available to children as they reach adulthood.



Art Therapy & Culture for Human Development to Rebuild the Country

Arts and culture were lost in a series of civil wars in the 20th Century. Intellectuals and artists were targeted and killed. In the 1990s following the Peace Agreement, most refugees returned home. Among them, a group of 9 teenagers who received art therapy in the refugee camps wanted to help rebuilding their country. They officially founded Phare Ponleu Selpak Association in 1994 with Veronique Decrop, French art therapy teacher.


